## Key Vocabulary for Understanding and Talking about *Night*:

## Section 1 (pp. 3-22)

- **1. Kabbalah:** Mystical aspect of Judaism; seeks to define the nature of the universe and the human being, the nature and purpose of existence, and other deep philosophical questions.
- **2. Torah:** The holy book of Judaism.
- **3. Hasidic:** Orthodox, very religious sect of Judaism.
- **4. Zohar:** Foundational text(s) of Kabbalah that discuss the origin and structure of the universe, the nature of souls, redemption, and the relationship between Darkness and Light, the universe and man.
- **5. Sighet:** Eliezer's hometown; a small suburb in Hungary.
- **6. Redemption:** The action of saving or being saved from sin, error, or evil.
- **7. Talmud:** In Hebrew, the word means "instruction, learning, teach, or study"; the Talmud is a religious text that contains the commentaries and opinions of thousands of rabbis; it is a very important and holy book in Judaism.
- **8. Maimonides:** Medieval Sephardic Jewish philosopher who became one of the most influential Torah scholars of the Middle Ages.
- **9. Peril:** Extreme danger.
- **10. Gestapo:** Secret police force developed in 1933 to undermine any opposition to the Nazi Government; managed the ghettos and organized the transportation/deportation of Jews to the Camps.
- **11. Empathy:** Stepping into another person's shoes and understanding what they are going through; expressing concern and compassion in a genuine way for someone else.
- **12. Apathy:** The state of not caring or failure to express compassion.
- **13. Divinity:** The state of being divine, or holy.
- 14. Pity: To feel sympathy and sorrow for one's suffering; to show compassion for someone's struggles.
- **15. Zionism:** National movement of the Jewish people that supports the establishment of a Jewish State (AKA Israel).

- **16. Anti-Semitic:** The hatred of and discrimination/prejudice against Jews.
- 17. Anguish: Extreme pain, distress, or anxiety.
- **18. Ghetto:** A quarter of a city in which Jews were forced to live in harsh, cramped conditions.
- 19. Synagogue: Jewish place of worship; often referred to as a *shul*.
